Dissertation “Anti-Establishment Political Parties: Conception, Measurement, and Consequences”

My dissertation explores the phenomenon of anti-establishment parties. I develop a conceptual definition and measurement scheme that encapsulates parties’ ideology and antipathy toward the elite/mainstream. I then explore how diffuse support influences vote choice for anti-establishment parties across the ideological spectrum, and the behavior of members of anti-establishment parties once seated in parliament.
